



Kids' Guide to Shurijo Castle Park


Even though the castle and towns were destroyed, the people kept the spirit of the Ryukyu that was created at the castle. Then in 1992, through efforts of many people

Why are there dragons at Shuri Castle?


A Dragons were the symbol of the King of the Ryukyu. That's why Shuri Castle is decorated with lots of dragons. If you look closely, you can see that they have four claws. The dragon was also the symbol of the Chinese emperor, but his dragons had five claws. Only the emperor of China could use a dragon with five claws, so the Ryukyu dragon could only have four. Why don't you try counting the number of dragons at the castle?



Why is the road in front of the main castle slanted?

A The road in front of the main castle is called the Ukimichi, and only the king and people of high rank could use it. There are various explanations on why the road is slanted. What can you see at the end of the Ukimichi? It's the most "sacred place" in Shuri Castle, the "Suimui Utaki". The Suimui Utaki was here long before the castle was built, and it's said that the castle was built around it. The important Utaki and main hall were linked, protecting the kingdom with sacred power, and so maybe that's why the road is slanted.





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
